WHAT IS PHYLLOXERA?

Phylloxera is a small, yellow insect that resembles a rose aphid (but much smaller). It only lives on the roots of vines and is present in infested vineyards in Victoria and NSW. It can cause the vines to decline and die.

YOU CAN HELP US

Phylloxera can be carried in soil, grapes, leaves or anything (including cars and bicycles) that picks up any of these. People can also carry the insect on their footwear or clothing.

Please remember:

- · Respect signage around the vineyard
- · Do not walk or drive amongst the vines
- Adhere to pathways and driveways
